

## Indexes to *SEVEN*, vols. 1-38 (1980-2022)

The following indexes to *SEVEN* include all essays, book reviews, obituaries, and major news articles or reports; general editorials, notes on contributors, books received, and news paragraphs are not indexed. The indexes have been updated to 2022, to include vols. 36-38 (18 essays, 29 reviews, and other items, including texts by the Inklings, and obituaries). Essays and articles published as online supplements to *SEVEN* are indexed; they can be found on the Wade Center website:

There are two indexes: to each item alphabetically by author's name, and by subject.

The Author Index gives full bibliographical details for each item, in the following order: author name, title, parenthetical genre note (as required), volume number, year of publication, and page range; the journal name *SEVEN* (between the item title and the volume no.) has been omitted. Individual items for each author are listed chronologically by date of publication. Short descriptive notes have been added to some uninformative titles. Collections of paragraph-length book notes are indexed as single articles, jointly-authored if necessary. From volume 35, articles in the online supplement are distinguished by page numbers with an 'e' prefix.

The Subject Index refers to entire articles, not to specific topics and pages within articles. Each article is indexed, usually a number of times, according to the main subject or subjects. In making these decisions, a certain degree of license is required; but almost every item will at the very least be indexed under name of one of the Seven. Location details are truncated, giving only the author's surname in brackets, followed by the volume number and first page number of the item; this will enable cross-referencing to the Author Index for full location details. Book reviews are indexed by the subject of the book and identified as reviews by the note "rev." before the name of the author (of the review). Book reviews are also gathered (under "Books Reviewed"), and are there arranged in alphabetical order by the name of the book's (first-named) author or editor; where there are three or more authors or editors, only that of the first is given; sub-titles are omitted or truncated where the book title makes the subject apparent. Paragraph-length book notes are indexed under Books Reviewed, but not otherwise. In the listing of Books Reviewed, books by the *SEVEN* focus authors are arranged by the editor (etc.), but they are also listed in the Subject Index under the name of the author. Where the *SEVEN* focus authors are mentioned in the Subject Index, including their full names in titles of reviewed books, only their initials are given. For new texts by the seven authors, published in *SEVEN*, see the Author Index.
